PROCEEDINGS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF KARNATAKA

Subject:- Grant of permission to start Homoeopathic Medical Colleges by the Belgaum Janatha Shikshana Samithi, Belgaum and Marathamandal, Belgaum.

- Read:-
- i) Representation dated 26.3.1982 from the President Janatha Shikshana Samithi, Belgaum.
 - ii) Representation dated 13.3.1982 from the President, Maratha Mandal, Belgaum.
 - iii) Letter No. KHS/1-88/81-82 dated 1.4.1982 from the President, Karnataka Board of Homoeopathic System of Medicine, Bangalore.

Preamble:-

In his representation dated 26.3.1982 cited at (i) above, the President, Janatha Shikshana Samithi, Belgaum has requested for grant of permission to start the Bharatesh Homoeopathic Medical College at Belgaum said Samithi.

Similarly, in his representation dated 13.3.1982 cited at (ii) above, the President, Maratha Mandal, Belgaum has requested for grant of permission to start a Homoeopathic Medical College at Belgaum.

In his letter dated 1.4.1982 cited at (iii) above, the President, Karnataka Board of Homoeopathic System of Medicine, Bangalore, has reported that the Belgaum Janatha Shikshana Samithi, Belgaum and the Maratha Mandal, Belgaum have applied for grant of permission to start Homoeopathic Medical College during 1982-83. It is also reported that the Inspection committee of the Karnataka Board of Homoeopathic System of Medicine, Bangalore has inspected the Janatha Shikshana Samithi, Belgaum and the Maratha Mandal, Belgaum and the said committee has recommended for grant of permission to these applicants to start Homoeopathic Medical Colleges.

In the circumstances, Government are pleased to accord permission from the current academic year only to start Bharatesh Homoeopathic Medical College at Belgaum and Maratha Mandal Homoeopathic Medical College, Belgaum by the Belgaum Janatha Shikshana Samithi and Maratha Mandal, Belgaum respectively to impart graduate education in Homoeopathic system of Medicine subject to the fulfilment of the following conditions failing which the temporary recognition now given will be deemed to have been withdrawn.

1) ADMISSION STRENGTH:
Graduate Course

(twenty/only)

- ii) All the admissions made in the college shall be provisional, and subject to approval of the Chairman, ^{Board of} Examiners in Homeopathic Education,
- iii) If approval of the Chairman is not taken, the admissions made will be considered as invalid and the candidates will not be eligible for appearing for the annual examinations.
- iv) Students admitted in excess of the number for which permission is now given by the Government, will not be allowed to take the examination.
- v) The students must keep up prescribed terms of studies.
- vi) 75% of attendance in the subjects is compulsory to be eligible for examination.
- vii) The following shall be the minimum fees leviable for the course (this amount is inclusive of all items like Sports, Reading Room, Tuition fees, Library, Laboratory, Medical fees etc.,)
Graduate Course: Rs. 700.00 per year
- viii) The following shall be the capitation fee leviable for the course.

a) Karnataka Students:

Graduate Course Rs. 3,000/-
(Rs. three thousand only)

b) Non-Karnataka Students:

Graduate Course Rs. 6,000/-
(Rs. six thousand only)

ix) ~~In order to provide minimum clinical facilities, there should be atleast 50 bedded hospital separately, located and established in a phased manner, as indicated below:~~

During 1982-83 - - - - 20 beds
During 1983-84 - - - - 40 beds
During 1984-85 - - - - 50 beds

The number of beds should be maintained at all times. In case the number of intake is increased, the number of beds will have to be increased.

x) The Hospital should maintain minimum accommodation,

- 1. Lecture Hall 6 (six)
- 2. Room with sufficient accommodation for Principal, Staff, Library, Reading Room, Dissection Hall -cum-Museum, Pathology and Physiology, Laboratory Pharmacy, Mysic and Materis Medico 10 (ten)

xi) The college should have atleast minimum requirements as prescribed by the Board.

- xii) Convenient tables and chairs should be provided to the students in each class (b) suitable furniture should be provided to the teaching staff.
- xiii) The following shall be the minimum staff for each course in addition to a Principal qualified in Homoeopathy with sufficient experience:-

Professors 4 (four)
Lecturers 8 (eight)

In addition to this the management of the college should also employ part-time teaching staff for other subjects. However, full time staff should be employed for each Department in a phased manner for each department.

The staff should be increased depending upon the increase in the intake of students fixed by Government,

It is further directed that the above conditions shall be kept in view by the college management. It is advised that if there is no substantial improvement during the year, the ad-interim recognition will not be continued.
